### ASSEMBLY:

A meeting of two or more Christians for the purpose of pursuing God, and may include Bible study, prayer, communion, or singing.

- Note that this does not mention "worship"
- Nor does it mention "class"
- Plus it does not mention location
- And it does not include the leadership of the congregation

### BACKGROUND & IMPORTANCE

- 2013
  - Women answering questions during sermon & issues raised
  - Elders' studied the issue & presented lessons to the congregation which said, among other things:
    - The Bible does not say that all women everywhere must remain silent and cannot teach men
    - We will have women "prophesy", as appropriate, and we will do that in what we consider worship or class settings. (In 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 14:3 Paul said that prophesy means to "strengthen, encourage, and comfort the church.")
- 2017/2018
  - Youth takeover where women prophesied and issues were raised
  - Elders re-studied the issue
  - 16 Week study: High level overview; in-depth studies; wrap-up; listening sessions; private meetings; conclusion

## LESSON LEARNED

# Findings that aren't implemented are soon forgotten

- The path forward was stated in 2013
- Little has been done to implement it
- Almost 5 years later we are still on Square One



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### GUIDELINES FOR BIBLE STUDY

### **1.No Contradictions:**

- Scripture is God's word. God does not contradict Himself, nor does Scripture
- If our understanding of one passage appears to be in conflict with another, we don't understand it or them correctly

### 2. Context & Consistency

- Understand the context of the passage
- Treat everything in the context consistently don't pick and choose
- It has to fit with the rest of the chapter, book, testament, and Bible

### 3.No Blinders:

- Don't read the Bible through our "traditional" lenses
- Read to understand how God intended for us to live our lives

### FINDINGS: MAIN QUESTION

### Do 1<sup>st</sup> Cor 14:34 & 35 and 1<sup>st</sup> Timothy 2: 11 & 12 mean that women everywhere must remain silent and cannot teach men?

As we will see, using the study guidelines it is fairly straightforward to realize that reading those passages in that manner is improper as it puts them in conflict with other passages in the same chapter, in other books by the same author, and in many other books of the Bible.

# FINDINGS: SECOND QUESTION

### If the answer to the main question is "no", then what do those passages mean?

It is highly probable that Paul was countering early gnostic claims as well as addressing issues arising from pagan temple worship practices that were rampant in the cities to which he wrote – Corinth and Ephesus.

- We must also remember if we find ourselves in the same situation, having a woman within our body who is boisterous, refusing to yield to scripture, violently demanding her way or the highway, then she is to have no part in teaching and must instead humble herself in quietness.
- There is also a principle being taught on how we are to engage in relationship with one another that promotes spiritual growth by putting the needs of others above our own.

### FINDINGS: Contradicting Passages?

#### The Only Passages Which Say Women Are To Be Silent or Cannot Teach

- 1<sup>st</sup> Cor 14: 34 & 35 "Women should remain silent"
- 1<sup>st</sup> Timothy 2:11 & 12 "I do not permit ... teach"
- Our traditional approach of reading the above passages as saying all women everywhere must be silent in the assemblies ignores the fact that doing so causes them to contradict many other passages in the Bible where women took a leading role.

#### Some Of The Many Passages Where Women Led or Taught

- 1<sup>st</sup> Cor 14: 26–33 Women & men praying, singing, & teaching
- 1<sup>st</sup> Cor 11: 5 Women praying & prophesying
- Acts 18: 26 Priscilla taught Apollos
- Acts 2: 17 Sons and daughters will prophesy
- Micah 6: 4 Miriam led God's people
- Judges 4: 4 Deborah was a prophet
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Kings 22 Huldah was a prophet
- Rom 16: 1 Phoebe a minister or deacon
- Rom 16:7 Junia an apostle
- Colossians 3:16 Singing is teaching & admonishing
- John 20: 18 Mary was told by Jesus to deliver the message that He was risen

# FINDINGS: Other Issues Against Traditional or Complementarian Views

- There is no differentiation in scripture between locations for assemblies. In other words, the idea of "class time" vs "worship" is one that man has contrived to get around a perceived issue.
- Spiritual gifts are not ever connected with gender in the New Testament. Again, in Galatians 3: 28 Paul said "…nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus". So why are we not using all of the gifts?

## POSSIBLE APPROACHES

- FACE VALUE: The difficult passages mean exactly what they appear to say, & women cannot speak or teach in <u>any</u> fashion in <u>any</u> assembly, men must pray with their hands raised, and women cannot wear gold, pearls, or expensive clothing
- PICK & CHOOSE: Out of a list of 7 things in only 5 verses we could choose to accept only 2 of them – the ones about women being silent & teaching, & ignore the rest
- <u>SPECIFIC ISSUES</u>: The two difficult passages are dealing with specifics in the two churches – Ephesus & Corinth

### THE ELDERS' CONCLUSION

- The only answer that is consistent with the ground rules of studying Scripture is that Paul's statements in 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians and 1<sup>st</sup> Timothy are to be understood as addressing issues specific to those churches – Corinth and Ephesus.
- In other words, Paul did not tell us that all women <u>everywhere</u> must remain silent and cannot teach men.
- Therefore women can scripturally do everything a man can do <u>in the assembly</u>. In other words, it is scripturally appropriate for a woman to preach, lead singing, make announcements, pass communion, read scripture, teach a class, lead the congregation in prayer, etc.
- We realize that this doesn't fit with our traditions. But our aim as leaders of this church is to apply teachings in a way that is consistent with Scripture, regardless of tradition.

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### ASSEMBLY:

A meeting of two or more Christians for the purpose of pursuing God, and may include Bible study, prayer, communion, or singing.

### NO DIFFERENCES:

- There are no differences between <u>locations</u> for assemblies
- There are no differences between <u>types</u> of assemblies
- There are no differences between <u>times</u> of assemblies



# IMPLEMENTATION

- The Elders understand that this is difficult for some to accept, but that does not make it wrong
- We <u>need</u> to utilize all of the gifts given to us by the Spirit, and that means we need to have women participating alongside men in the assemblies
- Just saying women are equal but doing nothing about it is playing like they aren't
- While we don't want to cause anyone problems, we do have to start the movement toward full participation
- Therefore, we ask that women pray and think seriously about participating in some way
- If you are considering participating in some role in the auditorium then perhaps it would be good to talk to the Elders initially to ensure we migrate slowly
- If you are moved to do something spontaneously, such as leading a prayer when someone asks for volunteers, then please do so.
