- 1. Paul is responding to actions taking place within the church.
 - 1. 7:1, 25, 8:1, 12:1 Now about...
- 2. Customs are discussed and there is no consensus over what custom.
- 3. Women were praying and prophesying in public.
- 4. The only time the word authority is discussed is verse 10.
- 5. We cannot neglect to connect v.11 with the preceding discussion.
- 6. This passage is greatly debated regarding correct translation and meaning of numerous words.
- 7. If nature teaches that long hair is a disgrace why did God make long hair part of the Nazarite vow?

....I do all this for the sake of the gospel... 9:23

I have the right to do anything... No one should seek their own good, but the good of others. 10:23-24

I am not seeking my own good but the good of many, so that they may be saved. 10:33
